As we reflect upon the past year, it is difficult to look at our successes and challenges without thinking about the tragic moment when our reality changed on October 7th. Our hearts break for Israel as we just witnessed the worst massacre of Jewish people since the Holocaust. We pray for the hostages still being held by Hamas and for the innocent civilians in Gaza.

Since the beginning of the war, antisemitic and other hate incidents have been surging across the globe and in our own community. Between Oct. 7 and Dec. 6, ADL San Diego recorded a 642%-percent increase in hate incidents compared to the same period last year. These alarming trends reinforce our determination to fight antisemitism and all forms of hate in our K-12 schools, college campuses, City Hall, and anywhere on the streets of our community.

This is why ADL San Diego is here. We are the region's line of defense against antisemitism and hate because of our unique decades-long partnership with law enforcement, our hands-on educational programs, our extensive advocacy efforts, and allyships spanning a vast network of agencies and communities.

Despite the many challenges that lie ahead, ADL San Diego will remain steadfast at pursuing our mission to stop the defamation of the Jewish people and secure justice and fair treatment to all. Together, we will stand against hate and create a better future.

ADL San Diego has been the leader in fighting antisemitism, and bigotry of all kinds, for over 40 years in America's Finest City. Our mission has always been the same: "to stop the defamation of the Jewish people and to secure justice and fair treatment to all." With a regional team and the support of a national network, we are boots on the ground responding to local needs.

Our Three Pillars

Investigate

We respond to antisemitic and hate incidents in coordination with law enforcement and key stakeholders. We use the latest technology and analysis to monitor, expose and disrupt antisemitism, extremism and hate. We train law enforcement and communities on current threats and different forms of hate and extremism.

Educate

Our innovative programs empower students, educators, communities and workplaces to embrace inclusion and diversity. We are a leading provider of antisemitism, Holocaust and anti-bias programming and resources.

Advocate

We speak out in the media, local communities and with our elected officials against antisemitism and hate. We engage with elected officials, policymakers and tech companies to shape policies that fight all forms of hate. We build strong partnerships and coalitions to fight antisemitism, hate and bias.

Since October 7th

As reported to our ADL San Diego office, antisemitic incidents since October 7th have increased by 150% in comparison to last year. Our staff has been on full alert and responding to the crisis on multiple fronts, leveraging our capabilities and leaning into our expertise and partnerships. We have:

- Responded to incidents off and online while coordinating with law enforcement
- Actively engaged elected officials and policymakers at the federal, state and local levels to denounce the Hamas attack and condemn antisemitism
- Spoken up against antisemitism in the media and at public rallies
- Monitored and responded to incidents of antisemitism at anti-Israel protests
- Called upon and engaged universities to better protect Jewish students on campus
- Co-launched the Campus Antisemitism Legal Line for students to report antisemitic incidents and receive legal counsel. Text CallHelp or 51555
- Co-launched Antisemitism-on-College-Campus Module for students and faculty to learn about antisemitism and how to confront it
- Provided K-12 schools with resources to respond to hate incidents and promote understanding and belonging
- Provided educational workshops on antisemitism and antibias to schools, universities and organizations
- Co-organized a San Diego LGBTQ+ Rally Against Antisemitism

Combating hate crimes remains a priority for the District Attorney's Office because of their insidious impact on victims and the ripple effect of fear and pain they leave on the community. In 2023, ADL San Diego responded to an unprecedented surge of antisemitic and hate incidents. These included the assault of a rabbi, thousands of antisemitic and anti-LGBTQ+ distributed flyers in our communities, dozens of swatting and bomb threats against synagogues, the vandalism of the House of Israel, swastikas and other hate graffiti in schools and on college campuses, harassment of Jewish students, and the hijacking of a city council meeting by an extremist and white supremacist group.

GLI offers participants an insider's perspective of ADL's programs and a deep understanding of the cutting-edge strategies employed to confront antisemitism and hate.
